(and when they do) Does Latam allow flight changes?

Yes, LATAM does allow you to change your flight, but it depends on the type of ticket you bought. Some fares are more flexible than others, so before you do anything, it's a good idea to check your confirmation email or log into your account. If that feels like a hassle, you can always call LATAM directly at [+1] [844] [586] [7938]. Their team can walk you through your options. In fact, if you're not sure where to even start, a quick call to [+1] [844] [586] [7938] can save you time and stress.
